

Prairie Ridge Prom Guidelines

Dear Students and Parents:

The Junior-Senior Prom should be a memorable and special event in the life of high school students. The following information is provided in order to help in planning for the 2008 Prom which will be held at The Stonegate in Hoffman Estates Friday, May 2nd, 2008. Ticket cost is \$60 per person or \$120 per couple and will be on sale at Prairie Ridge starting [Wednesday, April 16th](#). [The last day to purchase tickets will be Friday, April 18th](#). Once tickets have been purchased, there will be no refunds. Bus assignments are made at the time of ticket purchase and no changes are permitted.

All students and guests who attend the prom are required to ride District #155 buses to and returning from the site. No one using private transportation will be admitted. Please arrive at the school at 5:00 p.m. as the buses will load at 5:15 p.m. and return after the Prom arriving at school at approximately 12:00 a.m. Students attending the Booster-sponsored Post Prom event will go directly to Post Prom from The Stonegate.

School District #155 policy prohibits the use or possession of tobacco products on school property or at school events. It also prohibits the possession of, control of, use or consumption of, or being under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages. If you are having a party for any of the students, please keep in mind that the students will be held accountable for all school rules and regulations for the evening. A tobacco infraction will result in a three day suspension; an alcohol/drug infraction will result in a ten day suspension. All students who attend Prom must be in attendance at school on Friday, May 2, 2008 through the early release time of 12:53 pm. Anyone attending Prom must be under the age of 21. If a violation of District policy occurs during Prom, parents will be called to pick up the student at the Prom site. There will be no money refunded if a violation occurs.

We want the Prom to be a very enjoyable and safe evening. We will not allow a few students to disrupt the evening for the entire group. We merely expect the students and their guests to demonstrate behavior and conduct of which we can all be proud.
