



5. How many of your assignments each day do you normally complete?




6. On a daily basis, how much work are you being asked to do outside of class?


11. How easy is it for you to use the remote learning tools your school provides (Canvas)?


12. I feel my social-emotional needs are being met through fall remote learning?

***This question was not required. The district received 2,080 responses. The following are themes from the responses.

- Students want the option to return in-person
- Students are stressed/feel overwhelmed with the amount of homework
- In front of a computer screen for too long/lectures too long 1:15
- Students prefer Google Classroom/Google Meets over Canvas/Zoom
- Students would like a longer break Tues Fri. The 15 minutes break isn't long enough and would like longer passing periods
- Students would like assignments to appear more consistently on Canvas and for teachers to set up Canvas more uniform
- Students cited a lot of issues with Zoom connectivity
- Students prefer a remote learning model
- Concerns about their grades
- Students do not like the block schedule/prefer shorter class periods
- Students cited tech issues with older Chromebooks
- Students expressed frustration with gym classes
